AIM

Achieve Beyond Schools aims to support pupils who struggle to access full-time mainstream schooling. Pupils are referred by local authorities and all have SEND and/or SEMH needs. We work in partnership with parents/carers, local authorities, social workers, and virtual schools to provide safe, highly nurturing, and structured environments where pupils can thrive emotionally, socially, and academically.

We are committed to ensuring a fair, transparent, and consistent admissions process that applies equally to all placing authorities.

REFERRALS

A referral to our schools should be sent via email to information@abschools.uk and usually by the pupil's local authority. All referrals must be supported by adequate documentation (EHCP) and additional information (specific needs, support plans, or safeguarding) to allow an informed decision by the Headteacher about placement suitability.

Referrals may be considered for pupils who have the following needs:

- learning
- social, emotional, and mental health
- physical disabilities

or pupils who are:

- persistent non-attenders
- at risk of permanent exclusion
- requiring smaller group provision and an enhanced pastoral care and wellbeing.

Placements depend on availability within specific age groups/classes at the time of referral.

At Achieve Beyond Schools, Stafford:

- we cater for pupils in Years 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8.

Distance from our schools is not part of the admissions criteria and a referred pupil with a sibling at Achieve Beyond Schools will not be at any advantage over a referred pupil who does not.

DIRECT REFERRALS AND ADMISSIONS FROM FAMILIES

Direct referrals are very occasionally considered from private, fee-paying families. Interested families who do not wish their child to be placed through their local authority's SEND team should contact the school's Headteacher.

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

- Referrals to our schools are made by a pupil's local authority's special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) team, either in writing, via email or using an online portal. These referrals can be made with, or without, initial parental/carer consent/preference. Our fees are always provided on request to SEND team only.
- The Headteacher will review all submitted documentation to:
 - assess whether the pupil's needs can be effectively met
 - identify any required adaptations or support provisions
 - consider existing pupils.
- If a placement is available and the Headteacher and placing authority agree that the pupil's needs could potentially be met, an offer of an **initial assessment** for the pupil and family to visit and tour the school (a representative from the referral agency and any other professionals involved may also attend where appropriate). Headteachers will also explore with parent/carer and the SEND team whether the pupil has, or has had, involvement with social care services in order to gather as much information as possible, including information from a previous setting.
- Following the initial assessment visit, if the Headteacher feels the school is likely to meet the pupil's needs, an **assessment day** (usually a morning where the pupil attends and joins a class) can be scheduled. Following assessment day, a final decision on a placement offer will be made and communicated by the Headteacher to the family and in writing to the relevant SEND team on the same day.
- If the placement is confirmed by the local authority (usually following a decision at SEND Panel), an admission start date for the placement will be arranged by the Headteacher.
- Before a pupil is admitted and starts attending, a pupil induction meeting will be held with the pupil, family and Headteacher to complete:
 - pupil forms (including medical information)
 - consent forms
 - sign the pupil, home-school agreement
 - agree a transition plan. This can only be agreed once the schools are in receipt of completed pupil forms
 - to answer any other questions from either the pupil or parents/carers.

PLACEMENT DURATION AND REVIEW

- All placements are permanent but are subject to ongoing review in line with the pupil's progress, attendance, and engagement at EHCP Annual Reviews.
- Headteachers will always liaise regularly with referring local authorities and SEND caseworkers about individual pupils and placement suitability.
